Maria Teresa Natale, AthenaPlus project coordinator

Since 1985 she works in services for cultural institutions; from 2002 to 2008 she participated in the national and European activities of the 3 MINERVA projects (MINERVA, MINERVAplus, and MINERVA eC), being content manager of the relevant website, and responsible for the project Museo & Web, born in the framework of MINERVA. She cooperated with the MEDCULT project funded by UNESCO, and coordinated the 'Digital Heritage' work package of STACHEM. She was technical coordinator of the ATHENA project and involved in EuropeanaPhotography, Partage Plus, Europeana Collections 1914-1918, Linked Heritage, DC-NET, and INDICATE. She took part in the Europeana Working Group on users. She coordinates marketing activities in the Italian portal of Cultura Italia

Nathalie Paquet, manager of Urban Expé

Exploring new forms of storytelling, Nathalie Paquet gained her expertise in the creation of narrative links between tangible and digital. She has developed spatial stories, stories with a spatial structure and spatial characteristics.

She created Urban Expé in 2012 for designing urban digital experiences, the purpose of wich is to both entertain and explore the territory. The expertise of Urban Expé involves funding the appropriate technology for telling stories in a variety of spaces. The paper book and its digital extensions are also an exploration territory for it.

This year she co-funded "Imprudence". It's a experience design studio working on new forms of interaction, connecting our physical and digital worlds.

The Bibliothèque nationale de France collects, preserves and makes known the national documentary heritage. The BnF's collections are unique in the world: 14 million books and printed documents, manuscripts, prints, photographs, maps and plans, scores, coins, medals, sound documents, video and multimedia documents, scenery elements... All disciplines, whether intellectual, artistic or scientific, are represented in a comprehensive way. Today, the BnF's digital library, Gallica, provides access to over three millions documents.

Rossella Caffo, Michael Culture Aisbl

Director of ICCU until this year, she is since 2001 the Italian representative to the European National Representatives Group on Digitization, and since 2007 to the Member States' Expert Group on Digitization & Digital Preservation set up by the European Commission. She managed many national and international projects in this area, among others: Minerva, Michael, Michael Plus, Athena, Dc-NET, and now the Linked Heritage project.
